

An Introduction to Caring for People with Advanced Heart Failure

This study day will provide an overview of what is meant by the term ‘heart failure’ and the importance of the person and carers’ perspective in terms of ‘living with the condition’.

There will be an opportunity to consider how the person will be supported towards the end of their life both within an in-patient unit (hospital or hospice) and the community setting.
